

PIO Trainings

If you are new to your role or haven't yet taken the FEMA Basic or Advanced PIO courses, EOM Comms and HSEMA recommend that you take the following actions to work through online, self-paced courses to get oriented to your role as a PIO and to prepare for the possibility of supporting the Joint Information Center (JIC) during special events and emergencies. This will also help you immediately enroll in the Basic and Advanced PIO courses when they become available:
